

- ✓ Are more enthusiastic about what they are learning






Learners often **make new connections** between curriculum topics - and **discover links** between these topics and the world outside the classroom - with video as part of their lesson.



Video Annotation Laser-Focuses Learning

There is great benefit in an instructional lesson that allows the user to "**trim a video**" by setting "start" and "end" points – to make it possible to use one video across multiple targets in an activity or across several pages of an activity – playing different sections of that video. It is also very powerful to engage learners in choosing videos and trimming them as part of their assignments!
